Remembrance Sunday and 11 November (Remembrance Day) Wreath Laying Protocol

- 1. On Remembrance Sunday and 11 November (Remembrance Day) several local places of worship and other organisations invite TRDC to nominate a representative to lay a wreath on behalf of the Council.
- 2. There is no perfect formula for deciding who will lay the wreaths although Party politics is not be an issue in this matter.
- 3. The following protocol is to apply:
- 3.1 Wreaths can only be laid on Remembrance Sunday or 11 November (Remembrance Day)
- 3.2 The Chair of the Council has the first choice of which place of worship, school or war memorial they wish to lay a wreath.
- 3.3 The Ward Councillors, regardless of religion, places of worship attendance or politics get the first choice in their wards but can only lay wreaths in their own wards.
- 3.4 In the event of more than one Councillor in a ward wishing to undertake the wreath-laying, they must agree to resolve the matter between themselves, or take it in turns.
- 3.5 The only people who can lay wreaths outside a Ward, in order of preference, are:
 - The Chair of Council;
 - Armed Forces Covenant Holder; or
 - Leader of the Council.
- 3.6 By mid-October the final wreath-laying schedule should be circulated to Members by email. Those laying wreaths should be able to collect them at the October meeting of the Full Council.
- 3.7 The Lord Lieutenant and /or Deputy Lieutenant takes priority over the Chair in terms of wreath laying.
- 3.8 The Armed Forces Covent Holder for the Council may also lay a wreath on behalf of the Council on Remembrance Day.
- 3.9 A new location request to lay a wreath must be received to the Committee Team by 1 October and the decision on whether to include it in the agreed list will be decided by the Chief Executive in consultation with the Armed Forces Covenant Holder.
