- Opened on 1 May 1975
- A multi-purpose arts facility located in Rickmansworth town centre serving Three Rivers
- A 515 seat main auditorium with the ability to host flat floor events
- Separate function room with a capacity of 100
- A programme of live theatre, film, event cinema, pantomime and hires
- Operated and managed by six permanent members of staff, each with specific areas of responsibility
- 69 casual staff (Duty Front of House Managers, Technical, Box Office and Front of House)
- Supported by 81 volunteers

2022-2023 Performance

Highlights for the 2022/23 financial year include:

- 9802 tickets sold across 34 co-promoted live theatre shows
- 6,198 film tickets sold across 36 titles (including 12 event cinema screenings)
 - 14,075 pantomime tickets sold for Aladdin staring Amy Day and Joseph Elliott
- 171 hires by charities, local theatre groups, schools, commercial organisations and religious celebrations

Financial Position

2021/22

- Net turnover of £639,500 resulting in a net direct cost to the Council of £163,900
- The successful award of the £151,000 Culture Recovery Fund grants (£87,500 round two and £63,500 round three) significantly reduced this outturn position

 Net turnover of £1,004,700 resulting in a net direct cost to the council of £66,189

Capital Projects & Building Improvements

Projects in 2022/23:

- Refurbishment of the accessible toilet facilities
- Refurbishment of the main bar
- Completion of the full rewire of the venues bar, foyers and associated areas
- Completion of the projector server and associated works

Potential future projects: (subject to capital bid approval)

Replacement of the venue's electrical intake room

Participation

- Volunteering currently over 80 volunteers 'on the books'
- Work experience opportunities with over
 30 young people attending a 1-2 week placement
- Opportunities to perform in the pantomime

Accessibility

- Newly refurbished accessible washroom facility
- Infrared induction hearing system including audio describe facility for up to ten patrons attending cinema
- Touch tours (for specific events including pantomime)
- Relaxed and signed pantomime performances

Sustainability & Environment

Sustainability

Watersmeet has an energy efficiency rating of '26' (Oct 2021-22) which is a category 'B' and emits between 110-140 tonnes of CO2 each year. We have continued to take a number of steps to improve the energy efficiency and environmental impact including:

- When lighting has come to 'end of life', this has been replaced by lights with sensors or built in timers
- Replacement of Colne Room, upper foyer and bar lighting
- Continue to replace plastic packaging to more sustainable alternatives in the bar
- The What's on Guide and pantomime print is produced on Forest Stewardship Council® (FSC®) paper
- Clear signage is in place to encourage patrons to recycle
- Digital marketing screens have been installed to reduce leaflet collection when the venue is closed and eliminate the need for single use pull-up banners

Looking Ahead

Challenges

- Cost of living crisis is expected to have an impact on all ticket sales
- Increased energy costs will have a significant impact on the venue with electricity bills adding over £30,000 to the cost of running the theatre
- Late booking trend continues on the majority of events with the exception of pantomime which could be considered a family tradition

Positives

- Current panto sales are slightly ahead of the equivalent point in the last two years
- Watersmeet continues to be in a good visual condition following last year's capital investment

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 Attracting a range of high quality shows which has enhanced Watersmeet's reputation with audiences
