# Use of S016 Funding for benches at The Horses' Field, Leavesden Country Park (ADDCC)

## 1 Summary

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek approval to use S106 funding to purchase 2 new benches for use outside of the conservation grazed area on The Horses' Field, Leavesden Country Park.

## 2 Details

- 2.1 During the summer months at The Horses' Field, Leavesden Country Park, cattle graze the internal area as part of the Council's alternative grassland management regime.
- 2.2 This area is open to the public, however, some members of the local community opt to remain outside of the grazed area for various reason and instead choose to walk the perimeter of the site away from the cattle.
- 2.3 A request has been made from the public for 2 benches to be installed external to the area where the cattle graze.
- 2.4 These benches will be installed in locations away from residential properties and with good visibility in order to prevent anti-social behaviour.
- 2.5 Benches will include arm and back supports for those with additional needs.
- A Section 106 dated 15<sup>th</sup> June 2010 secured the payment of a "Recreation Contribution" of £400,000.00 (plus indexation) in respect of the majority of the land known as the Horsefield. The monies were given for "access and landscaping improvements, signage and commuted maintenance costs in relation to the Replacement Land (including pedestrian connectivity and accessibility improvements at Leavesden Country Park)". The benches will be placed on the Replacement Land. There is £749,415.29 S106 funding available in the "S106 Horses' Field Abbots Langley" S106 budget for the site, which could be used to purchase the two benches.
- 2.7 The cost to install 2 benches would be £1,720.

## 3 Options and Reasons for Recommendations

3.1 To agree the use of S106 funding for the purposes outlined in section 2.

# 5 Financial Implications

- 5.1 Costs to install 2 DDA compliant benches is £1,720.
- 5.2 £1,720 could be used to purchase these benches from the S106 Horses' Field Abbots Langley S106 budget.
- 5.3 There is £749,415.29 remaining in the S106 Horses' Field Abbots Langley S106 budget.

# 6 Legal Implications

6.1 The Council's Planning Solicitor has confirmed that there is a balance of those monies that remains unspent and that the use of those section 106 monies to purchase two benches would be in conformity with the purpose for which those monies were given.

# 7 Equal Opportunities Implications

- 7.1 Benches installed would be DDA compliant with arm and back supports. Benches would not be installed in proximity to residential properties and would be within areas of natural surveillance to reduce the possibility of anti-social behaviour.
